This past December, REACH (Recognizing | Experiencing | Asian | Cultural | Heritage) of Central Florida hosted its annual toy drive benefiting the local Harbor House as well as Frontline Outreach. With the help of over ten local high schools, companies, and organizations, REACH was able to raise over 700 toys for local children.

The Harbor House is a 24 hour safe haven for survivors of domestic violence and abuse that provides a safe home for them at no cost. For over thirty years, this organization has been providing survivors with counseling, daycares for children, professional job training, and other valuable resources to help them get back on their feet. Moreover, Harbor House provides legal assistance for the survivors and is an active ad-

vocate towards the ending of domestic violence and abuse. On December 19th, REACH members went to the organization's main campus and passed out toys to the children. The smile and the pure joy these kids have over getting a new toy is what makes this toy drive worth it.

This is the first year that REACH has partnered with Frontline Outreach, an organization in downtown Orlando that for over fifty years has provided children and family programs for urban youth as young as two years old. On December 20, around 20 REACH members volunteered at the organization's annual Community Christmas Event, helping set up, serve food, and pass out toys to kids.
